#### **Use the Timed Method**

The daily/weekly assignments are a general guide. Since it is widely accepted that students learn best when they learn at their own pace, Dr. Shormann recommends using the timed method. Students should work on their course a minimum of 4 days per week for no more than an hour or so per day. Regardless of how much of the lesson is completed during that time, the student should stop, and pick up where they left off the next day. Using this timed method ensures the student learns at their own pace without being overwhelmed or frustrated. Dr. Shormann actually studied this way in college. Rather than continuing to work homework while tired, he would stop and pick up the next day. Many times, answers he was stuck on the previous day would be quickly solved the next day.

## Limit Reading Assignments to One Hour (Earth Science does not have reading assignments)

The reading assignments are designed to prepare the student for the video lecture. The video lecture will teach the complex concepts which is much easier to understand. Therefore, it is not necessary to read for complete understanding. Simply review the reading assignment to become familiar with the content.

#### **Standard or Honors Course**
