There are 2 lessons (78 &103) in the Algebra 1, 2nd edition, that are not covered in the 3rd edition. They were omitted from the third edition because they aren't very necessary. There is a lot more in the 3rd edition on functions, and that is why there are so many references for text lesson 113. Understanding all of the CD-ROM lessons cross referenced to lesson 113 is not critical to your success in the 2nd edition, but it is important that you try to understand them all. Also, there are three lessons in the 3rd edition that are not covered in the 2nd edition., and you should watch these lessons as well. If cross referencing the lessons gets to be too much of a hassle, then I encourage you to purchase a 3rd edition text. It is a better book than the 2nd edition, and is worth the money.
